
Bought items have to have a list of ingredients on the packaging, so all we have to do for those things is make sure the packaging is available to read – don't throw it away until after the contents have been consumed!

REFLECTION

How do you feel when you get a gift? Do you want to keep it for yourself? Of course it depends on the sort of gift; a new tie, or a piece of jewellery, is probably meant just for you. What about a bar of your favourite chocolate? How about a box of biscuits? We regard some things as intended to be shared.

Jesus came as God's gift to us. Do we think of him as a gift to be shared? The problem we have may be that we don't know how. I can share a box of biscuits with someone who comes into the house. Would I go outside to share them more widely?

(The other week we were visiting Tina's mother in the care home. The residents had been making cakes. It turned out that these cakes, together with a cake made by the catering staff, were going to be taken to a charity in Lincoln to be given to the homeless.)

So we may share Jesus with those who come into the church, but we find it difficult to share him with those who don't. I would no more walk down the street trying to tell people at random about Jesus than I would walk out with a big box of biscuits. And, let's be honest, the biscuit would be much more welcome.

There are, however, times and occasions when it is easier to find opportunities, and Christmas is such a time. While there are people who want to take Christ out of Christmas—apparently Quebec is banning public prayer and has a minister for secularization—many people enjoy the celebrations at Christmas, love carols and will listen to the stories.

So let us take this opportunity to share a gift which is even better when shared, not forcing ourselves on others, but taking chances that are offered.
